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Detailed Reviewer's Report

1. Lack of Empirical Validation

 - *Issue:* Ethical considerations are listed but not explored through stakeholder perspectives.
 - *Suggestion:* Conduct brief interviews or surveys with filmmakers, actors, or legal experts to ground the ethical debate in real-world attitudes.
- 4. **Over-Reliance on a Single Hypothetical**
 - *Issue:* Using only the *Snow White* remake example limits generalizability.
 - *Suggestion:* Add a second case study (e.g., an action film or documentary) to show how Buccaneer Piracy might adapt across genres.
- 5. **Structure & Flow**
 - *Issue:* Transitions between sections (e.g., from mechanics to legal) feel abrupt.
 - *Suggestion:* Insert a "Methodology" or "Framework Overview" section to guide readers through the paper's logic before diving into each aspect.

Comments

- **Citations for Tools:**

When mentioning platforms like DeepFaceLab or Runway ML, include citations or footnotes to the most recent versions or relevant papers .
- **Terminology Consistency:**

Ensure terms like "deepfake casting" and "AI-generated derivative" are used uniformly throughout.
- **Typographical & Formatting Checks:**
 - Line 11: consider rephrasing "Open-source projects like DeepFaceLab already enable such recreations..." for clarity.
 - Add figure/table numbers if you introduce comparative tables (e.g., Conventional vs. Buccaneer Piracy).
- **Conclusion Enhancement:**

Rather than a general call for "legislative reform," outline 2–3 concrete policy recommendations or a roadmap for future research.
