Strengths:

- 1. **Highly Relevant Topic:** The manuscript addresses timely concerns regarding trade protectionism and its impact on emerging economies like Indonesia.
- 2. **Robust Methodology:** Uses a time-series econometric regression model with a well-structured set of equations and relevant data spanning from 2010 to 2024.
- 3. **Clarity in Theoretical Framework:** Effectively integrates multiple economic theories such as Comparative Advantage, Thirlwall's Law, and Endogenous Growth Theory.
- 4. **Empirical Validity:** Presents statistically significant findings with strong coefficients of determination (R^2), confirming the robustness of the model.
- 5. **Policy Relevance:** Offers practical recommendations for diversification, industrial competitiveness, and digital trade transformation.

Weaknesses:

- 1. **Data Source Transparency:** While sources are mentioned, more detail is needed on data preprocessing and potential limitations.
- 2. **Overemphasis on Hypothetical Scenarios:** The assumptions around tariff impacts and GDP effects rely on ceteris paribus conditions that may not reflect real-world complexity.
- 3. **Figure and Table Labeling:** Some visual elements (e.g., figures and tables) need clearer labels and integration with the text for better comprehension.
- 4. **Linguistic Refinement:** Minor grammatical errors and verbose expressions should be revised for clarity and professionalism.

Significance:
