Utility of mental state in prescribing homoeopathic medicine – A case report of tension type headache

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Abstract - Headache is the most common problem for which patient wants medical attention as it is decreasing the quality of life of person. TTH is a chronic head pain syndrome which is characterized by bilateral tight band like discomfort without any associated features i.e. nausea , vomiting, photophobia, phonophobia and aggravate with movements. Mental state is a situation that exists in organisms at all levels and in different area in response to certain stimuli (past as well as present) and is expressed in a qualitative manner through the functioning of organism. According to Dr. Hahnemann, Headache is one sided disease in which we get very few symptoms for getting similimum. So, mental state of patient during headache is very helpful for getting similimum.

INTRODUCTION -

Headache is the most common problem for which patient wants medical attention as it is decreasing the quality of life of person.

International headache society divided headache in two types -

1. Primary headache

2. Secondary headache

Primary headache – It is mainly benign headache i.e. all examination and investigation are normal. Causes of primary headache – Migraine, Tension type headache, cluster headache

Secondary headache - In this all examination and investigation are not normal and it is due to some central nervous system (CNS) disease for ex- subarachnoid hemorrhage, severe hypertension, meningitis, sinusitis etc.

Out of primary headache tension type headache is most common form of headache. Age and gender is a risk factor for tension type headache as it is maximum in females of reproductive age

group with a ratio of around 1:1.2 to 1:3 between male and female. For school going children,

age group is between 7 and 15 years.

CLASSIFICATION OF TENSION TYPE HEADACHE

Four types -

- 1. Infrequent headache
- 2. Frequent headache
- 3. Chronic headache
- 4. Probable headache

DIAGNOSTIC CRITERIA -

- INFREQUENT EPISODIC TENSION TYPE HEADACHE
- A. At least 10 episodes of headache occurring <1 day/month on average (< 12 days/year) and full filling criteria B-D
- B. Lasting from 30 minutes to seven days
- C. At least two of the following four characteristic:
- 1. Bilateral location
- 2. Pressing or tightening (non pulsating) quality
- 3. Mild to moderate intensity
- 4. Not aggravated by routine physical activity such as walking or climbing stairs
- D. Both of the following
- 1. No nausea and vomiting
- 2. More than one of the photophobia or no phonophobia
- E. Not better accounted for by another ICHD-3 diagnosis

• FREQUENT TENSION TYPE HEADACHE

At least 10 episodes of headache occurring on 1-14days /month on average for > 3 month

(>12and < 180 days/year) and fulfilling criteria B-D

- A. Lasting from 30 minutes to seven days
- B. At least two of the following four characteristics:
- 1. Bilateral location
- 2. Pressing or tightening (non pulsating) quality

- 3. Mild to moderate intensity
- 4. Not aggravated by routine physical activity such as walking or climbing stairs
- C. Both of the following –
- 1. No nausea and vomiting
- 2. No more than one of the photophobia or phonophobia
- D. Not better accounted for by another ICHD- 3 diagnosis

CHRONIC TENSION TYPE HEADACHE

- A. Headache occurring on > 15days/month on average for >3 month (>180 days/year), fulfilling criteria
- B. Lasting hours to days, or unremitting
- C. At least two of the following four characteristic :
- 1. Bilateral location
- 2. Pressing or tightening (non pulsating)quality
- 3. Mild to moderate intensity
- 4. Not aggravated by routine physical activity such as walking or climbing stairs
- D. Both of the following :
- 1. No more than one of photophobia, phonophobia or mild nausea
- 2. Neither moderate vomiting nor severe nausea
- E. Not better accounted for by another ICHD-3 diagnosis
- PROBABLE TENSION TYPE HEADACHE

Tension type like headache missing one of the features required to fulfill criteria for a type or subtype of tension type headache and not fulfilling criteria for another headache disorder.

MENTAL STATE - In aphorism 173 and 174 of 6th edition of organon of medicine, Dr. Hahnemann classified headache as one sided disease with internal complaints.



As seen in repertorial result Bryonia, sepia (14/6), Nux Vomica (14/5), Gelsemium (11/5) are very close to each other. Gelsemium was prescribed because it covers both mental state i.e

anxiety during headache and dullness during headache.

Conclusion – This case shows that homoeopathy is effective if we prescribe medicine on the basis of mental state.

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
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
