However, the manuscript would benefit from minor revisions related to formatting, referencing, and contextual expansion.

Detailed Reviewer's Report

Strengths:

- 1. The manuscript addresses a timely and policy-relevant theme, especially in the context of skill development and employability in technical education.
- 2. It provides a strong empirical foundation using a validated questionnaire, descriptive statistics, and t-tests to assess stakeholder perceptions.
- 3. The discussion section effectively integrates literature and data findings, reinforcing the practical importance of the study.
- 4. The inclusion of industry perspectives alongside educators' views makes the findings robust and multi-dimensional.
- 5. Clear and practical recommendations are provided to bridge institutional gaps and modernize vocational training.

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Weaknesses:

- 1. Some paragraphs are too lengthy and contain repetitive phrasing, which may affect reader engagement.
- 2. Limited demographic information of respondents is provided, which restricts deeper interpretation of subgroup responses.
- 3. The presentation format, especially spacing, subheadings, and tables, needs minor improvements for clarity.
- 4. Several references, particularly digital and institutional ones, require formatting corrections and completeness.
