Reviewer's Comment:

This study addresses an important and underexplored area by examining the link between depression severity and suicidal intent in first-time suicide attempters. The methodology is appropriate, and the findings are clinically relevant. Minor revisions are needed to improve formatting, clarify some methodological details.

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Detailed Reviewer's Report

- 1. The study lacks an abstract, which should be added for clarity and professionalism.
- 2. The concept of suicidal intent is briefly defined but would benefit from a proper citation and a clearer explanation of its components.
- 3. The study uses a cross-sectional design conducted at a single tertiary care hospital, which limits causality and generalizability.
- 4. Sample size of 50 is relatively small, which may limit statistical power and robustness of subgroup analyses.
- 5. The sampling method (e.g., consecutive, convenience) is not clearly described and should be specified for reproducibility.
- 6. It is unclear whether assessments were self-reported or clinician-administered, which impacts the objectivity and consistency of scoring.
- 7. There is no mention of inter-rater reliability or rater training, which is important when using clinician-rated scales like MADRS and SIS.
- 8. The discussion for focusing on first-time suicide attempters is sound but could be expanded to emphasize why this group is clinically or socially distinct.
