#### **Reviewer's Comment**

The manuscript presents a rare and well-documented case of coffin birth (postmortem fetal extrusion) following maternal death due to hanging. The topic is unusual, relevant in forensic medicine, and contributes to awareness of a phenomenon that may otherwise raise suspicion of malpractice or foul play. The manuscript is generally comprehensive but requires improvement in structure, clarity, and referencing.

### **Detailed Reviewer's Report**

### **Strengths:**

- The case is clearly described with detailed forensic observations.
- Historical and global perspectives on coffin birth are incorporated.
- The manuscript highlights the forensic significance of the phenomenon in ruling out foul play.

### Weaknesses & Areas for Improvement:

- Language & Grammar: The text contains grammatical errors, inconsistent tense use, and some colloquial expressions that should be revised for scientific clarity.
- **Abstract:** Needs restructuring to follow standard format (background, case description, conclusion). Currently, it reads more like a case summary.
- Case Report Section: Very detailed but overly descriptive; some repetition should be reduced, and the findings presented in a more systematic format (e.g., external findings, internal findings, fetus findings).
- **Figures:** Mentioned in text (Fig 1, Fig 2) but images are missing in the provided file. Ensure proper inclusion with ethical clearance.

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- **Discussion:** While informative, it would benefit from more recent literature and a deeper forensic interpretation linking the case to practical implications in India.
- **References:** Several references are mentioned with superscripts (e.g., 1, 2, 3) but not listed at the end. A complete reference list in appropriate style (e.g., Vancouver) must be added.
- Conclusion: Needs tightening to focus on the forensic importance of distinguishing coffin birth from suspicious circumstances.

The case is valuable and publishable, but significant improvements in writing, organization, and referencing are required to meet scientific publication standards.
