Reviewer's Comment for Publication.

This case report describes a 57-year-old woman with clear cell renal cell carcinoma who developed gastric metastasis, a very rare event. The patient was initially treated with sunitinib for metastatic RCC with stable disease for years. Later, a gastric lesion was found during routine imaging, initially suspected to be primary gastric cancer. Surgery and histopathology with immunohistochemistry confirmed it was metastasis from RCC. The case highlights diagnostic challenges and the importance of multidisciplinary evaluation in rare metastasis.

Strengths:

1. Reports a rare metastatic site with detailed clinical, imaging, and histopathological findings.
2. Highlights the diagnostic difficulty due to similarities with primary gastric cancer.
3. Multidisciplinary approach described clearly.
4. Emphasizes importance of immunohistochemistry for accurate diagnosis.

Weaknesses:

1. Single case report limited generalizability.
2. Lack of long-term follow-up after surgery.
3. No detailed discussion on molecular or genetic aspects of RCC metastasis.

Overall Assessment:

This article provides valuable clinical insight into a rare presentation of metastatic RCC. It is well-written, clinically relevant, and useful for oncologists and surgeons dealing with atypical metastases
