### Reviewer's Comment / Report

### **Strengths:**

- 1. **Comprehensive Scope:** The paper thoroughly explores various models of integrated care, including medical management, multidisciplinary clinics, and digital/telehealth interventions, providing a holistic overview.
- 2. **Evidence-Based Content:** Incorporates recent clinical guidelines, systematic reviews, and case studies, enhancing credibility and relevance.
- 3. Clear Structure: The paper is well-organized with logical progression from background, methods, results, to future directions, making it easy to follow.
- 4. **Focus on Future Directions:** Emphasizes innovative solutions like telehealth and personalized care, aligning with current technological trends.
- 5. **Patient-Centered Perspective:** Highlights the importance of psychosocial support and health literacy, underlining a holistic approach to care.

#### Weaknesses:

- 1. **Limited Critical Analysis:** The paper predominantly summarizes existing literature without sufficiently critiquing the quality of evidence or discussing conflicting findings.
- 2. **Sparse Discussion on Implementation Barriers:** While barriers like access and health literacy are mentioned, a deeper analysis of systemic obstacles, resource limitations, and policy challenges would strengthen the discussion.
- 3. Lack of Quantitative Data: There is minimal presentation of statistical data or meta-analytical results that quantify the benefits of integrated care.
- 4. **Typographical and Grammatical Errors:** Some sentences contain minor typos or grammatical mistakes that could affect readability.

## **Recommendations for Changes/Modifications:**

1. **Enhance Critical Analysis:** Include discussions on the quality and limitations of cited studies. Address any conflicting evidence to provide a balanced view.

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- 2. **Deepen Barrier Discussions:** Expand on systemic, infrastructural, and policy-related barriers affecting implementation, especially in resource-limited settings.
- 3. **Incorporate Quantitative Data:** Present statistical outcomes or meta-analytical findings to substantiate claims about benefits.
- 4. **Proofreading:** Correct typographical errors and grammatical mistakes. For example:
  - On page 17, in reference, clarify the context as the line just shows "6."
  - Ensure consistent use of tenses and proper sentence structure throughout the document.
- 5. **Formatting Consistency:** Uniformly format headings, references, and citations for improved professionalism.
- 6. **Add Visual Elements:** Consider including tables or figures summarizing key models, outcomes, or barriers for visual clarity.
