This article reports two cases of Hair-Thread Tourniquet Syndrome (HTTS)—a rare pediatric emergency where a strand of hair tightly wraps around a body part, commonly a toe, causing pain, swelling, and tissue damage. Both infants in the study presented with unexplained crying, which led to the discovery of hair strands around their toes. After immediate removal, the infants recovered without complications.

1. Limited sample size (only two cases).
