Detailed Reviewer's Report

Overall, the paper presents a comprehensive, well-structured, and academically grounded discussion on the necessity of amending and supplementing Vietnam's Law on Public-Private Partnerships (PPP) to meet the requirements of the green transition. The author clearly situates the issue within both global and domestic contexts, highlighting the interplay between international obligations (such as the Paris Agreement) and Vietnam's national strategies (such as the Net Zero 2050 goal and Green Growth Strategy). The paper successfully integrates theoretical perspectives, international experiences, and policy analyses, demonstrating a strong understanding of governance, institutional design, and sustainable development frameworks. The paper's main strength lies in its comprehensive contextualization.
