This paper presents a comprehensive socio-demographic and educational analysis of Muslims in West Bengal using Census data (2001–2011), the Sachar Committee Report (2006), and field-based evidence. It offers an in-depth critique of educational inequality, gender disparity, and regional backwardness through a mixed-method framework. The work demonstrates academic rigor and policy relevance, though it requires minor refinement in statistical presentation and citation formatting.

Recommendation: Accept after minor revision.

Detailed Reviewer's Report

STRENGTHS

- 1. Adopts a robust mixed-methods design integrating quantitative (Census) and qualitative (FGD/interviews) data.
- 2. Provides strong spatial and demographic analysis highlighting Muslim-concentration districts (Murshidabad, Malda, Uttar Dinajpur).
- 3. Engages meaningfully with the Sachar Committee (2006) findings and subsequent policy responses.
- 4. Incorporates intersectional analysis, gender, class, and geography, using recent research (Dasgupta, 2021; Chakraborty & Mukherjee, 2019).
- 5. Offers actionable recommendations for infrastructure, bilingual education, and girls' empowerment.

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WEAKNESSES

- 1. The paper is lengthy and may benefit from condensing some descriptive historical data.
- 2. Graphs and figures need consistent labeling and APA 7 style captions.
- 3. Discussion section should include comparative references to Muslim education in other Indian states (e.g., Kerala, UP).
- 4. References should standardize hyperlinks and DOI formatting.
- 5. Conclusion could emphasize implications for future longitudinal research.
