### Reviewer's Comment for Publication.

A broad, readable review that clearly introduces core AI-in-education constructs and balances promise with caution. The paper's structure supports non-technical audiences and highlights classroom-level implications. However, the "review" designation needs a transparent search/selection protocol and clearer synthesis of evidence strength. With minor revisions to methods reporting, evidence mapping, and implementation guidance, the manuscript will be a valuable, policy-relevant reference.

## Detailed Reviewer's Report

### **STRENGTHS**

- 1. Clear panorama of AI applications with accessible explanations for educators and administrators.
- 2. Consistent framing of adaptivity, feedback, and data-informed instruction keeps conceptual focus.
- 3. Balanced discussion of benefits and risks, including equity, privacy, and bias.
- 4. Logical organization from vision to practice with classroom-level anchoring.
- 5. Useful orientation for policy and leadership audiences seeking an overview.

### WEAKNESSES

- 1. Lacks explicit protocol (databases, search strings, inclusion/exclusion, screening steps).
- 2. Limited empirical anchoring (few effect sizes/comparators; weak validity discussion).
- 3. Sections sometimes catalogue tools rather than synthesize "what works for whom."

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- 4. Implementation facets (PD time, cost, infrastructure, governance) not operationalized.
- 5. No evidence-strength classification or mapping across outcomes/populations.
