Detailed Reviewer's Report

This study explores the management of children's property in Islam, emphasizing that while children have the right to own wealth, they are not yet capable of managing it independently due to their physical and mental immaturity. Islamic law assigns this responsibility to trustworthy guardians or trustees who must act with integrity to safeguard the child's welfare and property. Drawing on the Qur'an, Hadith, and juristic opinions, the study explains that a child's legal capacity develops in stages from the fetus to the discerning child and finally to maturity. Until a child attains full intellectual and moral maturity, their property must be carefully managed for their best interest. Islam requires that guardians spend reasonably, invest wisely, pay zakat on behalf of the child, and hand over the property only when the child is capable of managing it responsibly. This ensures that the child's rights, welfare, and future stability are fully protected under Sharī'ah principles.
