The paper highlights the diagnostic complexity and prognostic implications of RHS, particularly in patients with comorbid conditions such as diabetes mellitus.

Strengths:

- The topic is **clinically relevant and educationally valuable**, addressing an uncommon but significant cause of peripheral facial paralysis.
- The case is **well-structured**, providing a detailed clinical course, diagnostic findings, treatment protocol, and follow-up results.
- Audiovestibular testing data (VNG, vHIT, VVS) are described with precision, adding technical rigor to the report.
- The discussion effectively integrates **current evidence** (up to 2025) regarding treatment outcomes and prognostic factors.
- Ethical and conflict of interest declarations are properly stated, adhering to publication standards.

Weaknesses / Suggestions for Minor Revision:

- 1. **Language and grammar:** Minor linguistic polishing is recommended for smoother readability (e.g., consistency in tense and punctuation).
- 2. **Abstract:** Could be slightly condensed to emphasize key clinical findings and treatment outcomes more clearly.

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- 3. **Figures/Illustrations:** If available, include representative images (e.g., auricular vesicular lesions, nystagmography results) to enhance visual impact.
- 4. **Discussion:** Consider expanding briefly on the **pathophysiological explanation** for bilateral posterior canal involvement, which is an atypical feature.
- 5. **Conclusion:** Add a concise statement emphasizing the *importance of early diagnosis and prompt antiviral therapy* to improve outcomes.
- 6. **Reference formatting:** Maintain uniform citation style (e.g., spacing, punctuation, and consistent numbering).

Overall Evaluation:

This is a **scientifically sound and well-presented case report** that contributes valuable clinical insight into the diagnosis and management of Ramsay Hunt Syndrome with vestibular involvement. With **minor revisions** for language and presentation, it is **suitable for publication**.
