The inclusion of Khelo India, SAI, PCI, and other schemes enriches the argument and enhances practical relevance. Some sections, particularly the literature integration and programme descriptions, can be condensed for improved flow. Minor formatting, sequencing, and citation consistency issues should be addressed.

- Uses updated and credible references, including Government of India reports, UN documents, and peer-reviewed sources, enhancing scholarly rigor.

4. Clearly identifies strengths, gaps, and implementation challenges, allowing for nuanced interpretation of policy execution.
5. Recommendations are specific, actionable, and aligned with adaptive physical education, accessibility audits, and teacher capacity-building.

WEAKNESSES

1. Some policy descriptions (especially NEP and RPwD provisions) are repeated across sections and can be streamlined to reduce redundancy.
2. Implementation pathways occasionally read descriptive rather than analytical; deeper critical commentary would strengthen academic depth.
3. A few paragraphs are very dense and would benefit from clearer sub-thematic breaks.
4. Formatting inconsistencies in section numbering, spacing, and table alignment should be corrected for publication readiness.
5. The conclusion is comprehensive but slightly lengthy; condensing would enhance clarity and focus.
