- 1. A chorioangioma is a benign tumor of the placenta made of blood vessels, typically found in about 1% of pregnancies. While small chorioangiomas are often asymptomatic, large or multiple tumors can cause serious complications for the fetus , such as anemia, fetal heart failure or growth restriction and for the mother like polyhydramnios or preeclampsia.**
- 2. Vascular tumors are growths that develop from cells that line blood vessels or lymph vessels and can be either benign or malignant.**
- 3. Common benign types include hemangiomas, which often appear in infants and may disappear on their own, while malignant types include vascular sarcomas and kaposi sarcoma.**
