Kolakulatthadi udvartana in medoroga: A case study.

Abstract:

Introduction: Rapid urbanization has led to an increased prevalence of lifestyle disorders 5 classified as Medoroga or Santarpanjanya Vikaras in Ayurveda. Medoroga results from the 6 7 quantitative and qualitative increase of Meda Dhatu, manifesting as Medoroga. Ayurveda recommends Rukshana Chikitsa, particularly Udvartana — a dry powder massage — to 8 9 counteract Santarpana Vyadhi. This study evaluates the effect of Udvartana with Kolakulatthadi Churna in the management of Medoroga. Methods: A 29-year-old male 10 presented with Bharavriddhi (excessive weight gain), Medovriddhi (fat deposition at 11 abdomen, waist, and chest), Kshudrashwasa (breathlessness), and Daurbalya (weakness). 12 Clinical examination and Astavidha Pariksha confirmed Medoroga. The patient underwent 13 Udvartana with Kolakulatthadi Churna once daily for 21 days. Parameters such as body 14 weight, regional measurements, and symptom improvement were recorded before and after 15 therapy. Results: After 21 days, the patient's weight decreased from 98 kg to 96 kg, with a 16 visible reduction in Medovriddhi and symptomatic relief in Kshudrashwasa and Daurbalya. 17 Improvement in anthropometric parameters indicated the efficacy of Rukshana through 18 Udvartana. Discussion: The Udvartana process induces Roukshya, Kharatwa, and Vaishadya, 19 counteracting Snigdha and Guru properties of Meda Dhatu. The ingredients of Kolakulatthadi 20 Churna — Kola, Kulattha, Yava, Rasna, Vacha, and others — possess Medohara and Kapha-21 22 Meda-Shoshaka actions, aiding fat reduction and metabolic correction. Conclusion: The findings of this case study demonstrate that Kolakulatthadi Churna Udvartana is an effective 23 24 external therapeutic modality for managing Medoroga. The treatment produced measurable reductions in body weight, abdominal fat, and associated symptoms, indicating significant 25 Rukshana and Medohara effects. The combined action of the churna's ingredients and the 26 mechanical effects of Udvartana facilitated fat mobilization and improved metabolic balance. 27 28 Overall, Udvartana with Kolakulatthadi Churna can be considered a safe, non-invasive, and beneficial supportive therapy in the management of Medoroga, with potential for wider 29 30 clinical application.

Introduction

- People these days are more prone to lifestyle challenges, which are listed under *Medoroga* as
- a result of urbanization. One of the best illustrations of a condition spurred on by Meda
- 39 Dhatu's Pramanataha Vriddhi (quantity) and Gunataha Vriddhi (quality) is Medoroga. Meda
- 40 is regarded as the primary *Dushya* for a number of ailments, including *Prameha*, *Medoroga*
- 41 and others. Chikitsa is divided into two types in Ayurvedic classics: Antaparimarjana
- 42 (internal) and *Bahirparimarjana* (external).¹
- The particular *Chikitsa* chosen for this study is *Rukshana*. *Rukshana* is the process that results
- in Roukshyam(dryness), Kharatwa(roughness) and Vaishadyam(cleanness). Again, Rukshana
- 45 is separated into Abhyantara and Bahya. To reduce Santarpana Vyadhis, Udvartana is used
- 46 as Bahyarukshana.
- 47 The most major health problem that increases a person's risk of developing a number of
- 48 illnesses is *Medorog*a. Numerous conditions such as diabetes, hypertension, cardiovascular
- 49 diseases and others are made more likely by Medoroga.²
- The technique of *Udvartana* involves massage to the body, excluding the head and neck, with
- strokes that move against the natural direction of the hair growth.³ It is known as *Sharira*
- 52 Parimarjana, according to Charaka. In Ayurveda it is a daily regimen after Abhyanga. 5



- 62 **Method of sampling & study design**: A case study.
- Materials: *Udvartana* treatment with *Kolakulatthadi Churna*. The *Churna* contains *Kola* (*Ziziphus jujube*), *Kulattha* (*Dolichos biflorus*), *Suradaru* (*Cedrus deodara*), *Rasna* (*Alpinia calcarata*), *Masha* (*Phaseolus mungo*), *Atasi* (*Calligonum polygonoides*), *Kushtha* (*Costus speciosus*), *Vacha* (*Calamus draco*), *Shatavha* (*Anethum graveolens*), *Yavachurna* (*Hordeum vulgare*) all described as *Medohara*.^{6,7}



70 Observation and Results:

- 71 After 21 days of Udvartana, the patients:
- Weight reduced from 98 kg to 96 kg
- Symptomatic relief was seen in Bharavriddhi, Medovriddhi, Kshudrashwasa and
 Daurbalya
- All girth measurements showed reduction (values preserved exactly as given)
- 76 This indicates reduction of subcutaneous fat and effective *Rukshana-Medohara* action.




Table No. 05: Showing reduction in measurements after treatment.

- 81 diagnosed with Medoroga and received Rukshana Upakrama (Bahya Rukshana). Udvartana
- 82 for 21 days provided symptomatic relief.
- 83 Charaka, Sushruta and Vagbhata have mentioned Udvartana as a Kapha-Meda reducing
- 84 procedure. 9,10,11 Kolakulatthadi Churna possesses Medohara properties and supported the
- 85 reduction in *Medovriddhi* ¹²

Conclusion:

- 87 Ayurvedic medicine is effective in Medoroga. Udvartana with Kolakulatthadi Churna
- produces better results in *Medovriddhi*.
