Detailed Reviewer's Report

Strengths of the Paper

- Clear Focus on a Traditional Ayurvedic Treatment The paper provides an insightful case study of Udvartana with Kolakulatthadi Churna, illustrating its application in managing Medoroga.
- **Detailed Description of the Intervention** The methodology, including the preparation of the herbal formulation and the procedure of Udvartana, is described comprehensively, facilitating reproducibility.
- Quantitative and Qualitative Outcome Measures The study reports measurable outcomes such as weight reduction and girth measurements, along with symptomatic relief, providing tangible evidence of the treatment's efficacy.
- Integration of Traditional Concepts with Modern Assessment The paper effectively links Ayurvedic principles with clinical observations, demonstrating a harmonious approach between traditional knowledge and contemporary evaluation.
- **Potential Clinical Relevance** The findings suggest that Udvartana with Kolakulatthadi Churna could serve as a supportive, non-invasive therapy for lifestyle-related obesity, which could inspire further research.

Weaknesses of the Paper

- Limited Sample Size The study is based on a single case, which restricts the generalizability and scientific strength of the conclusions.
- Lack of Control Group Without a comparative group or placebo, it is difficult to attribute observed effects solely to the intervention.
- **Short-term Follow-up** The follow-up duration appears limited to 21 days; long-term effects and sustainability of benefits are not addressed.
- Inadequate Detailing of Statistical Analysis The paper does not include statistical analyses to validate the significance of the results.
- **Absence of Ethical Clearance Mention** There is no mention of ethical approval or informed consent, which is vital even in case studies.
- **Formatting and Presentation Issues** The layout and organization of references, tables, and figures are inconsistent, which impacts readability.
- Limited Discussion on Possible Limitations and Confounding Factors The discussion does not critically appraise potential biases or the influence of external variables.

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Reviewer Comments

- Ethical Clearance: The manuscript does not mention approval from an ethics committee or obtaining informed consent from the patient, which is a necessary procedural requirement even for case reports. Clarification is advised.
- *Methodology*: The intervention description is adequate but lacks details on the standardization of the herbal powder and monitoring of adverse effects.
- *Typographical and Language Issues*: Minor typographical mistakes are present; overall, the English language quality is acceptable but could benefit from proofreading for clarity.
- *Formatting*: Consistent formatting of headings, references, and tables should be improved for better readability and professionalism.
- Clarity of Objectives, Results, and Conclusion: The objectives are clear, and the results are described adequately; however, the conclusion could emphasize the limitations of evidence due to the single-case nature.
- *References*: The references are appropriate but need standardization in citations. Also, international references like the article on obesity risks enhance the manuscript's credibility.
- *Missing Information*: Details such as the specific criteria used for diagnosis, patient consent, and potential adverse effects are absent and should be included.
