### Reviewer's Comment for Publication.

This case report describes a 32-year-old woman with sudden vision loss in one eye. MRI showed an optic nerve sheath meningioma. She was treated with high-dose steroids, which improved her vision and reduced the tumor swelling on MRI after one month. Her condition stayed stable for 11 months. The report highlights that meningioma should be considered in young women with optic neuropathy.

### Strength:

1. Clear case description
2. Good use of tests (MRI, OCT, VEP, ERG)
3. Shows strong response to treatment
4. Useful clinical message

### Weakness:

1. Single case only
2. Steroid effect on meningioma not well established
3. Limited long-term follow-up beyond 11 months

### Overall assessment:

A well-written and informative case report. Useful for clinicians and suitable for publication with minor improvements.
