Detailed Reviewer's Report

- 1. A patient safety culture is a shared set of values, beliefs and behaviors in a healthcare organization that prioritizes preventing patient harm, emphasizing open communication, teamwork, continuous learning, leadership commitment and fair handling of errors, ultimately leading to better patient outcomes and experiences.
- 2. It is about creating an environment where everyone feels safe to speak up about potential risks and is confident that issues will be addresses, fostering an atmosphere of mutual trust and shared responsibility for safety.
- 3. Assessing staff nurses involves evaluating clinical skills, soft skills professionalism, and professional development using methods like performance reviewer, self evaluations, skills checklists and competency exams, with goals of ensuring quality patient care, identifying training gaps and supporting career growth through continuous feedback and standardized criteria.
- 4. Perceptions of patient safety culture vary but generally show a positive view of teamwork and overall safety, though significant gaps exist, especially in nonpunitive responses to errors, staffing

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adequacy, and open error reporting with healthcare staff often feeling blame culture persists despite positive intentions, highlighting needs for better leadership, training and systems to truly learn from mistakes.
