Detailed Reviewer's Report

- 1. The back of the tongue is naturally covered in normal bumps, including large, dome shaped circumvallate papillae and smaller foliate papillae on the sides, which contain many taste buds.
- 2. Other bumps can be caused by temporary issues like canker sores irritation from acidic foods, or infections. If bumps are persistent, unusually large, or accompanied by severe pain, swelling or other concerning symptoms, it is best to see a doctor or dentist to rule out serious conditions like allergies, infections or cancer.
