1. Emergency anesthesia provides immediate pain relief and sedation for critical patients needing urgent surgery or stabilization, focusing on rapid airway management swift induction, and essential monitoring to handle high risk situations like trauma, obstetric emergencies, or severe illness, preventing aspiration and improving outcomes despite heightened risks.
2. Key techniques include pre oxygenation, rapid sequence induction and using emergency drugs like ketamine, often with protocols from handbooks to manage cognitive load.
