Reviewer's Comment for Publication.

Strengths:

3. The adoption of Organizational Culture and Identity Theory provides a suitable and coherent theoretical lens for explaining persistent inter-agency rivalry.
4. The qualitative methodology, including key informant interviews and document analysis, is appropriate for exploring institutional dynamics and perceptions.
5. The paper offers clear policy-oriented recommendations, particularly the call for an integrated and enforceable legal framework to compel intelligence coordination.

Areas for Improvement (Minor Revisions Suggested):

1. **Language and presentation:**
 - The manuscript contains frequent grammatical errors, typographical issues, and inconsistent spacing, which affect readability.
 - Sentence structure should be simplified in several sections to enhance clarity and flow.
2. **Conceptual clarity:**
 - Some key concepts (e.g., rivalry, coordination, collaboration) are repeatedly defined across sections; consolidation would reduce redundancy.

3. Methodological detail:

- Greater clarity is needed on data analysis procedures, including how themes were derived and how interview data informed findings.
- Ethical approval and consent procedures could be summarized more concisely.

4. Structure and focus:

- Certain sections of the literature review and institutional description are overly detailed and could be streamlined to maintain focus on the research problem.
- The findings section could be more explicitly distinguished from background and descriptive content.

5. Referencing consistency:

- Ensure uniform citation style and consistency in referencing policy documents, reports, and web sources.

Conclusion:

The manuscript makes a valuable contribution to the study of intelligence coordination and security governance in Nigeria. With minor revisions addressing language clarity, structural coherence, and methodological transparency, the paper is suitable for publication.
