Detailed Reviewer's Report

1. **Pleomorphic adenoma (PA) is the most common benign tumor of the salivary glands, especially the parotid gland, appearing as a slow-growing, painless lump that's a mixture of epithelial and myoepithelial cells, sometimes called a "mixed tumor" due to its diverse cell types, and while usually cured by surgery, it carries a small risk of turning malignant carcinoma over time if left untreated, requiring careful removal due to potential recurrence.**
2. **Submandibular localization refers to the position of the paired submandibular salivary glands, found just *below the jawbone (mandible)*, in the submandibular triangle of the neck, wrapping around, making them palpable under the chin and contributing to saliva production, draining via Wharton's duct into the floor of the mouth.**
3. **An adenoma is a non-cancerous (benign) tumor that forms in glandular tissue, like in the colon (adenomatous polyp) or endocrine glands (adrenal, pituitary, thyroid). While usually harmless, some, especially colon adenomas, can become cancerous over time, so they are often removed. Symptoms vary by location but can include**

abdominal pain, fatigue, headaches, or signs of excess hormones if "functional," though many are asymptomatic and found incidentally.
