### Reviewer's Comment for Publication

The manuscript addresses an important and socially relevant topic by examining the impact of media and globalization on juvenile behaviour and crime, with a specific focus on Arunachal Pradesh. The regional emphasis on a tribal and culturally distinct state adds contextual value to the study and contributes to discussions on social change, youth behaviour, and criminology in rapidly globalizing societies.

### Strengths

#### 1. Relevance of the topic:

#### 2. Theoretical grounding:

The use of established criminological perspectives, including Social Learning Theory, Cultural Criminology, and Strain/Anomie Theory, provides a solid conceptual framework for understanding how media exposure and global consumer culture may influence juvenile behaviour.

#### 3. Clear regional focus:

By situating the discussion within Arunachal Pradesh, the manuscript highlights the

impact of globalization on tribal communities, traditional values, and informal social controls, which strengthens the sociological relevance of the study.

4. **Balanced perspective:**

The paper acknowledges both the positive and negative impacts of media and globalization, offering a nuanced discussion rather than a one-sided critique.

### Points Requiring Minor Revision

1. **Methodological limitations:**

The study relies entirely on secondary sources. While this is acceptable for a descriptive and analytical paper, the limitations of this approach should be explicitly acknowledged. The inclusion of empirical data or case illustrations would strengthen the analysis.

2. **Clarity and language refinement:**

Some sections contain long sentences, minor grammatical errors, and typographical issues. A thorough language and editorial review is recommended to improve readability and academic presentation.

3. **Strengthening analytical depth:**

Certain sections remain largely descriptive. Greater critical engagement with existing literature and clearer linkage between theory and the specific context of juvenile crime in Arunachal Pradesh would enhance analytical rigor.

4. **Objectives and structure:**

The objectives could be more precisely formulated, and the paper would benefit from clearer sub-headings in later sections to improve logical flow and coherence.

5. **Conclusion needed:**

A concise conclusion summarizing key findings, implications for policy and juvenile justice, and suggestions for future research should be added.

### Overall Assessment

The manuscript presents a **relevant and well-theorized discussion** on media, globalization, and juvenile crime, particularly within a culturally sensitive regional context. With minor revisions addressing language, structure, and analytical depth, the paper would be suitable for publication.
