Detailed Reviewer's Report

The manuscript offers a timely and policy-relevant empirical assessment of whether Skill India vocational training programs enhance employability outcomes in India, with clearly articulated objectives and hypotheses, a strong grounding in human capital theory, and an extensive literature review that situates the study within both global and Indian scholarship; the use of a relatively large sample, stratified purposive sampling, and multiple statistical techniques including t-tests, chi-square tests, ANOVA, and regression strengthens the analytical rigor, while the findings convincingly demonstrate that trained workers outperform non-trained counterparts in employment status, job readiness, income, and skill–job matching, alongside meaningful regional and sectoral variations; however, the paper would benefit from greater transparency regarding questionnaire development and reliability testing, clearer reporting of regression coefficients and goodness-of-fit statistics, deeper discussion of potential self-selection bias and causal limitations inherent in the cross-sectional design, and minor language polishing for consistency and precision, particularly in the interpretation sections; overall, the study makes a valuable contribution to employability and skill-development literature and, with modest improvements in methodological exposition and presentation, would be suitable for publication consideration
